Church behavior: We make the sign of the cross with holy water, using the right hand, upon entering & leaving church. This is a reminder of our Baptism & our redemption through the cross of Christ

We genuflect, or bow deeply, to the Blessed Sacrament when entering or leaving the pew, or when passing the altar where the Blessed Sacrament is reserved. This is a mark of adoration & worship, not to be omitted.

It is courteous not to move about in church during the readings & the Eucharistic Prayer in order to maintain a reverent atmosphere.

Liturgical note: The congregation should stand as the first notes of the "Alleluia" are played before the Gospel. During the Creed, the congregation bows at the words: "by the power of the Holy Spirit He was born of the Virgin Mary, and became man."

Drinking: Start Talking Before They Start

What you need to know:

- *Many kids start drinking in middle school.
- *One out of every two 8th graders has tried alcohol.
- *More kids use alcohol than tobacco or illicit drugs.
- *More children are killed by alcohol than all illegal drugs combined.
- *Children who begin drinking alcohol before the age of 15 are 5 times more likely to develop alcohol problems than those who start after 21.
- *Alcohol use among youth is strongly correlated with violence, risky sexual behavior, poor academic performance, & other harmful behaviors.
